

Guiding Lines for Papers

Papers should not exceed 30.000 characters (no spaces).
Put in a summary of maximum ten lines at top of the article.
Remember to inform about your current professional/academic situation.

Please sent in your paper in as basic a layout as possible; this means:

- a) All of the text must have the same set-up.
- b) Do not use any fancy layout with different fonts or the like.
- c) Place titles and paragraph titles in bold.
- d) To emphasize please use *italics*.

For quotations and literature please respect the following guiding lines:

- a) Use “quotation marks” when quoting.
- b) Quotes which exceed five lines are placed in a paragraph of its own and left and right margins are indented.
- c) If possible when quoting from the oeuvre of Nietzsche use the KSA, and:
- d) Always inform about the paragraph alternatively chapter heading and paragraph.
- e) Quoting other authors refer to (author, year: page), e.g. (Deleuze, 2006: 183).
- f) Please use this standard for information about literature used in the article:
Deleuze, Gilles (2006 [1962]): *Nietzsche and Philosophy*. London, New York: Continuum.
